Goachers	Maidstone, Kent	Gold Star Strong Ale	5.1%	A strong pale ale brewed from 100% Maris Otter malt and East Kent Goldings hops.
Hopdaemon	Newnham, Kent	Dominator	5.1%	Sponsored by: Chambers, Folkestone A Premium Bitter/ESB
Hopdaemon	Newnham, Kent	Leviathan	6.0%	Sponsored by: The Coastguard, St Margaret's Bay A strong ruby ale with spicy hop aromas and a rich malty finish. Brewed from the finest malted barley and Kentish hops this 'BEAST' of a beer is deceptively easy-drinking for its strength.
Larkins	Chiddingstone, Kent	Porter	5.2%	Each taste and smell of this potent black winter beer (Nov-Apr) reveals another facet of its character. An explosion of roasted malt, bitter and fruity flavours leaves a bittersweet aftertaste.

Wantsum	Hersden, Kent	Portly Pig	5.2%	Deep, rich, burnt chocolate and smoky malt on the palate. Delicate hop bitterness and floral notes from 100% British Fuggles hops, combined with vintage port to give an incredibly smooth Porter.
Westerham	Edenbridge, Kent	Audit Ale	6.2%	A strong ale, brewed to the 1938 strength and using the same ingredients as the original best selling bottled beer of the Black Eagle Brewery. Made with pale and crystal malts on a huge charge of Kent Goldings hops.
Westerham	Edenbridge, Kent	Double Stout	5.5%	Brewed by our Irish head brewer, Rob Gargan, to the style and strength of the Black Eagle Brewery's famous Double Stout 1939 gyles. Made with a blend of coloured and roasted malts, Described by Rob as follows: "Rich roasted stout with dark fruits (prune) with a smooth body followed with a hint of bitterness."

Allgates	Wigan, Lancashire	Unhinged	7.5%	Sponsored by: Park Inn, Dover A vintage strong winter ale. Not a beer for wimps. Strong in colour and flavour. Only one batch will be brewed so order early to ensure yours.
Ascot	Camberley, Surrey	Anastasia's Imperial Stout	8.0%	A true imperial stout that was awarded overall Champion Beer of the festival & Best Stout at the 2009 Woking Beer Festival
Ballard's	Petersfield, Hampshire	Duck House	9.0%	A very rich barley wine with flavours of caramel and an underlying hoppy finish.

Beartown	Congleton, Cheshire	Black Bear	5.0%	Champion Winter Beer of Britain 2010: Old Ales and Strong Milds Bronze medal winner Advertised as a strong mild, this beer is rather bitter for the style. Bitter and malt flavours are balanced and there is also a good roast character along with a hint of liquorice. Aftertaste is short and reasonably dry.
Beowulf	Brownhills, Staffs	Killer Stout	7.9%	Jet black strong stout with an intensely bitter roast coffee flavour
Black Country	Dudley, W.Midlands	English Winter	5.5%	A well balanced brown ale with a complex character of fine Marris Otter malt, choice Fuggles and Goldings hops. Dangerously moreish.
Black Hole	Burton upon Trent, Staffs	Milky Way	6.0%	A pale wheat beer, brewed using Mount Hood and Styrien Golding hops which provide a bitter sweet finish to this strong ale.
Bowman	Droxford, Hampshire	Nutz	5.0%	Not a session beer this one. One to be savoured sitting by a roaring log fire. Aroma of Chestnuts, intriguing Chestnut flavours and rather Chestnutty in colour. Which is as it should be, as it is brewed with organic Chestnuts from the farm of Patrice Dupre in the Ardeche region of France. May contain nuts!

Cairngorm	Aviemore, Highlands	Wildcat	5.1%	A deep amber coloured ale with a complex malt and fruit flavour, with a delicate bitterness from Challenger and Fuggles hops. Strong and distinctive.
Cathedral	Lincoln, Lincs	Magna Carta	5.0%	Brewed using Maris Otter with a hint of crystal malts and wheat with Perle and Progress hops. A golden full bodied ale with a hint of caramel finishing with a light hoppy flavour.
Cotleigh	Wiveliscombe, Somerset	Snowy	5.0%	A straw coloured golden winter ale. Using pale flagon malt and goldings hops, a full bodied long lasting and morish ale with hints of citrus fruits.
Derby	Derby, Derbyshire	Quintessential	5.8%	Complex, well-rounded with extraordinary fruit and citrus flavours.
Dorking	Dorking, Surrey	Red India Ale	5.0%	Sponsored by: Sabreur and Tally Ho A delicious, strong 5% hoppy beer similar to an IPA. The colour of dark cherries, this beer has a fruity sweetness like berry and dried fruits, with a smooth full bodied taste. This ale has a beautifully balanced combination of hop and malt. The Perle hops add a rounded buttery taste, while the Centennial hops add the fruity notes, and the grains add a toasted malty depth.

Exmoor	Wiveliscombe, Somerset	Stag	5.2%	A pale brown beer, with a malty taste and aroma, and a bitter finish.
Green Jack	Lowestoft, Suffolk	Mahseer IPA	5.0%	An India Pale Ale as it was always intended to be. A strong bitter and very hoppy which has been Brewed with the finest American Hops.
Sarah Hughes	Dudley, W. Midlands	Snowflake	8.0%	Copper-coloured barley wine. Strong, sweet flavour with a hoppy aftertaste
Sarah Hughes	Dudley, W. Midlands	Surprise	5.0%	A bittersweet, medium-bodied, hoppy ale with some malt.
Keltek	Redruth, Cornwall	Beheaded	7.6%	Beheaded is Keltek's strongest ale and is extremely deceptive with a smooth, slightly sweet flavour and none of the normal alcoholic "twang" often associated with very strong beers. It must be enjoyed with respect.
Leyden	Bury, Great Manchester	Crowning Glory	6.8%	A surprisingly smooth beer for its strength, ideal for cold winter nights.
Loddon	Dunsden, Oxon	Forbury Lion IPA	5.5%	An IPA as an IPA should be, packed with a full malty flavour and a strong hop finish.
Milestone	Newark, Notts	Dark Galleon	5.4%	Smooth English strong bitter, with rich molasses overtones, dried fruit and rum aroma and hints of sultanas and treacle. "Try with Christmas pudding or mince pies"
Milk Street	Frome, Somerset	Bobbled	5.0%	An English Strong Ale
Milton	Milton, Cambridgeshire	Colossus	5.6%	Pale and hoppy, this well balanced bitter beer belies its powerful strength and can surprise the unwary!
Moor	Pitney, Somerset	JJJ IPA	9.0%	Copper-coloured, new world triple IPA. Immensely hoppy and malty.
Moor	Pitney, Somerset	Somerland Gold	5.0%	Hoppy blonde ale with hints of honey and a long, hoppy finish.

Moorhouse's	Burnley, Lancashire	Pendle Witches Brew	5.1%	Well-balanced, full-bodied, malty beer with a long, complex finish.
Museum	Burton upon Trent, Staffs	Czar's P2 Stout	8.0%	This exceptionally smooth stout is produced from the original recipe that was shipped to the Russian port of St. Petersburg for the Czar's Imperial Court. The smooth mellowness derives from the long maturation time in cask before being bottled in very limited numbers.
Museum	Burton upon Trent, Staffs	White Shield	5.6%	A full-bodied beer with a clean, fresh flavour and balanced bitterness. Made with Halcyon barley and Northdown and Challenger hops.
North Cotswold	Stretton-on- Fosse, Warwickshire	Hung, Drawn 'n' Portered	5.0%	A black treacle porter.
Old Bear	Keighley, W. Yorks	Hibernator	5.0%	A complex rich dark ale dominated by roast and bitter flavours against a background sweetness. Look for roast coffee, hints of caramel and dark vine fruit on the nose. The finish is distinctly bitter and quite astringent.
Oldershaw	Grantham, Lincs	Alchemy	5.3%	A golden, premium hoppy beer brewed with First Gold hops.
Poachers	N. Hykeham, Lincs	Trout Tickler	5.5%	Sponsored by: Jeanette and Mandy Ruby bitter with intense flavour and character, sweet undertones with a hint of chocolate.
Ramsbury	Marlborough, Wilts	Deer Hunter	5.0%	A rich ruby colour ale using the best roasted barley and English fuggles hops producing a full bodied and warming hoppy ale.
RCH	Weston-Super- Mare, Somerset	East Street Cream	5.0%	Pale brown strong bitter. Flavours of roast malt and fruit with a bittersweet finish.
Rother Valley	Northiam, E. Sussex	Blues	5.0%	A dark brew full of complex tastes such as chocolate, raisins and a roast finish. Deceptively smooth
Skinner's	Truro, Cornwall	Betty's BIG Sister	5.3%	Deceptively easy to drink, this Winter warmer has, like it's little sister, a light hoppy aroma with underlying maltiness and full flavour with a smooth finish. Great companion for those long Winter nights!

Spectrum	Norwich, Norfolk	Old Stoatwobbler	6.0%	Rich and creamy old ale with dark chocolate digestive flavour. Roast and vine fruits with a touch of caramel mask a background hoppy bitterness. A long sustained finish.
Spectrum	Norwich, Norfolk	Trip Hazard	6.5%	A sweet, fruity brew with bubblegum notes throughout. Smooth bodied and easy drinking. A bitter hop undertow lightens the sweet resinous maltiness towards the sustained end.
St. Judes	Ipswich, Suffolk	St. Mary's Stout	6.0%	A dark, rich stout.
Teignworthy	Newton Abbot, Devon	Malster's Ale	5.0%	This winter ale is brewed in celebration of the malster's art. It is rich and dark but highly drinkable and available in bottles all year round.
Teignworthy	Newton Abbot, Devon	Winter Daze	5.4%	Fruity winter brew, Dark Crystal malts gives it a lovely dark/mahogany colour.
Thornbridge	Bakewell, Derbyshire	Halcyon	7.7%	Rich fruit and hop character in aroma. Chewy, juicy malts and intense hoppiness coming through in mouth with a hint of tangerine and pear drops. Ends with a well-balanced bitterness.
Thornbridge	Bakewell, Derbyshire	Jaipur IPA	5.9%	Sponsored by: Narrowboat Rosie White Cliffs Festival of Winter Ales 2009: Beer of the Festival Complex, well-balanced IPA with a lovely blend of citrus and fruit flavours mixed with a slight sweetness and ending with a lingering, bitter finish.
Thornbridge	Bakewell, Derbyshire	St, Petersburg	7.7%	Full-bodied beer in the style of a Russian imperial stout. A combination of coffee, liquorice and roasted malt flavours gives way to a long bittersweet finish and aftertaste.
Tipples	Norwich, Norfolk	Crackle	6.5%	A real winter warmer. In addition to the dark malty swirls and fruity hop notes, this ale gets an extra burst of flavour from the blend of whole spices we add during brewing.
